



CEIAG YEAR GROUP PROGRAMME OVERVIEW 2023-2024

YEAR 7

Aims - Pupils will have an understanding of what careers education is and will be introduced to the sources of support and guidance open to them. They will be introduced to the key themes of self-awareness, career awareness and career management. Pupils will have the opportunity to identify and reflect on their own careers aspirations.

- Understanding yourself, describing your strengths and preferences
- Identifying your personal network of support including how to access impartial CEIAG
- Developing your ability to make plans and decisions carefully to help you get the experience you need
- Demonstrating the qualities and skills you need for employability and provide evidence of them
- Opportunities to attend trips to local companies/STEM/Colleges/Universities to explore the types of training / careers available

YEAR 8

Aims - Pupils will understand the key factors of management – self-awareness, opportunity awareness, learning to cope with transition and decision making. They will investigate their career ideas through the use of computer aided guidance and draw together an action plan regarding their KS4 options

- Identifying what you want from your future pathway
- Beginning to develop an understanding of budgeting and making action plans
- Looking at the choices and opportunities open to you when you reach a decision point - your GCSE option choices
- Identifying how to stand up to stereotyping and discrimination that may damage you and those around you
- Recognising when you are using the skills and qualities needed to be enterprising
- Identifying Option choices to support you with your future pathways
- Opportunities to attend trips to local companies/STEM/Colleges/Universities to explore the types of training / careers available

YEAR 9

Aims - Pupils will explore how career choices can impact on aspects of adult life eg. economic & social. They will gain an insight into how important budgeting becomes when balancing income with outgoings and be introduced to the concept of income tax and VAT. Pupils will have the opportunity to identify the skills employers seek and consider the importance of making effective personal decisions

- Showing that you can be positive, flexible and well-prepared at key transition points in your life

YEAR 10

Aims - Pupils will prepare for their work experience placement by considering a number of issues such as; attending an interview, health & safety, how to manage new situations. Pupils will identify targets that they would like to achieve while on their placement and be introduced to the log book.
