Uniform & Equipment	<p><i>'Wear our uniform with pride'.</i></p> <p>Purbrook Park has developed a high standard of education and dress. We are rigorous in upholding the school uniform, and it is expected that pupils wear it well and with pride. This includes to and from school, and on school visits and excursions. All pupils must ensure:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ Their tie is worn correctly.✓ They have their blazer on (unless given permission to take it off).✓ Their shirt is tucked in.✓ They have the correct skirt/ trousers and plain black shoes✓ They are not wearing make-up or jewellery, other than one plain gold or silver stud in the lower earlobe, and a watch. 

Food Practical Reminders

FAJITAS **7Y 19.2.24** **7Z 20.2.24**

If you are bringing in your own ingredients, please use the recipe below and bring in cooked chicken only. Please remember a container to put it in.

FAJITAS



Ingredients

1 lime

1 clove garlic

½ green chilli

Small bunch of coriander

1 x 10ml spoon oil

1 small chicken breast
(or 3 - 4 thighs)

½ onion

½ green pepper

1 tomato

25g Cheddar cheese

2 tortillas

1 x 15ml spoon guacamole (or salsa), optional

Method

1. Prepare the marinade:
 - squeeze the lime; peel and crush the garlic; de-seed and slice the chilli; chop the coriander
 - stir everything together with the oil.
2. Remove any skin from the chicken and cut the chicken into strips. Mix with the marinade and place in the fridge, covered, until needed.
3. Prepare the remaining ingredients with a clean knife on a clean chopping board:
 - slice the onion and green pepper; chop the tomato; grate the cheese
5. Add the marinated chicken to the wok or saucepan and stir-fry for about 4 minutes. Check that the chicken is cooked.
6. Add the onion and green pepper and continue to cook for a further 2 minutes.
7. Spread a little chicken in the center of the tortilla, add some tomato, cheese and guacamole, then roll up.
8. Serve and eat

YEAST BASED PIZZA



Ingredients

75g Strong White flour

25g Strong Wholemeal flour

Extra flour for dusting

½ tsp salt

1 sachet yeast

1 X 10ml oil

3 tbsp warm water

Tomato puree

Cheese

Toppings of your choice

METHOD

1. Preheat oven to 200C fan/ gas mark 6
2. Mix Dry ingredients in a large bowl
3. Stir in the yeast and make a well in the middle
4. Combine both the oil and water into a jug before pouring into the bowl
5. Slowly pour in the mixture and mix well until a ball of dough has formed. Knead for 5 minutes
6. Grease the baking tray
7. Roll out and shape the dough into the desired shape and place the dough onto the baking tray
8. Spread the sauce across the base, leaving a gap for the crust, arrange the toppings on top.
9. Bake for 10 - 15 minutes




In this modern life, where trolls set the tale.




NLGU's role model is... Michelle Obama!




