Sparsholt College's next open event is on Wednesday 1 May 2024 (Slots between 5.30pm – 7.00pm)



Food Practical Reminder

ROULADE – 10B 18.04.24



Please bring in all the ingredients you will need to make a roulade. Below is a recipe to make a strawberries and cream one that you can use or you can find your own roulade recipe and choose what ever fillings you want.

<u>Ingredients</u>

- 250ml milk
- 1 vanilla pod or 3 tsp vanilla essence
- 3 large egg yolks
- 50g caster sugar
- 1 rounded tbsp plain flour
- knob of butter
- 1tsp each cornflour, white vinegar and vanilla extract
- 4 eggs whites
- 100g caster sugar
- 100g icing sugar, plus a little extra
- 150ml tub double cream
- 450g strawberries

Pour milk into a pan. Split vanilla pod lengthways and scrape out seeds, adding both to the pan. Slowly bring to the boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 2 mins. Meanwhile, put egg yolks, sugar and flour into a bowl. Using an electric beater, whisk until pale and fluffy. Whisk in a third of the hot milk, then add remainder. Add mixture to the pan and bring to the boil, stirring, until the custard is thickened. Reduce heat and simmer for 2 mins, stirring constantly. Fish out vanilla pod, beat in the butter and pour into a bowl. Cover surface with cling film, leave to cool, then chill. Can be made 1 day ahead.

Heat oven to 160C/140C fan/gas 3. Line the base and sides of a 23 x 33cm Swiss roll tin with baking parchment. Blend cornflour, vinegar and vanilla extract to a smooth paste. Tip egg whites into a clean bowl. Mix together sugars in a separate bowl. Whisk egg whites until stiff, then gradually whisk in the sugar, alternating with a little paste until the mixture is thick and glossy. Spoon into the prepared tin and smooth the top. Bake for 20 mins until crisp on top. Meanwhile, whisk the cream and fold into the custard.

Remove the meringue from the oven and turn out onto a sheet of baking parchment, peel off the lining paper and leave to cool for a few mins. Spread the custard evenly over the meringue to within 5cm of the short ends and to the edge of the long ends. Scatter with the sliced strawberries. Using the parchment to help you, roll up the meringue from one short end. Transfer to a flat plate and dust with icing sugar.




Good News Story

Sporting Super Star

On 14th March 2024, Syrus Akhtar (10ERJA) took part in the British Disabilities Masters. These British Gymnastics Championships were held at the M&S Arena in Liverpool. To qualify to take part in the competition Syrus competed at the Men's Disability British Championships in Lilleshall (the centre of British gymnastics) in October last year, where he became the silver medallist in the Junior Mens Category. After this competition the top six men from a number of different disabilities categories (including Adult & Juniors) qualify to compete on each piece at the Masters. Syrus qualified for 5 of the 6 pieces.

Syrus achieved a Bronze medal on the Parallel Bars and a Silver medal on the High Bar. This is the highest possible competition currently being run for disability gymnasts in the UK as it is not yet a Paralympic sport so there are no international competitions, making this a really high achievement.
