RISOTTO

METHOD



1. Crumble 1 stock cube into a jug. Add 500ml of boiled water and stir.
 2. Heat 1/2 tsp olive oil in a shallow sautépan or deep frying pan over a medium flame. Add 1/2 finely chopped onion and 1 finely chopped garlic clove. Fry for about 3 mins until soft.
 3. Stir in 40g chopped chestnut mushrooms, season with salt and pepper and continue to cook for 8 mins until the fresh mushrooms have softened.
 4. Stir in 40g chopped chestnut mushrooms, season with salt and pepper and continue to cook for 8 mins until the fresh mushrooms have softened.
 5. Tip risotto rice into the pan and cook for 1 min.
 6. Keep the pan over a medium heat and pour in a quarter of the stock. Simmer the rice, stirring often, until the rice has absorbed all the liquid.
 7. Add about the same amount of stock again and continue to simmer and stir - it should start to become creamy, plump and tender. By the time the final quarter of stock is added, the rice should be almost cooked. Add the cooked bacon.
 8. Continue stirring until the rice is cooked. If the rice is still undercooked, add a splash of water. Add the butter and scatter over the grated parmesan and stir.
- Take off the heat and sprinkle over some fresh parsley

METHOD

300g strong bread flour
1 sachet of yeast
1 tsp sugar

200mls warm water
1 tbsp oil

Method

1. Mix dry ingredients in a large bowl.
2. Stir in the yeast and make a well in the middle.
3. Combine the oil and water in a jug before pouring into the bowl.
4. Mix with a plastic spoon and then knead well for 5 minutes.

Bagels

Divide into 6, shape into rings. Lower carefully into a pan of boiling water. When they are floating, remove from pan and bake in a hot oven (180-200°C) until golden brown.

Match Report

**Match Report – Hampshire Cup, Round 2
Purbrook Park Year 8 vs. Toynbee School
Final Score: Purbrook Park 8–1 Toynbee**

Purbrook Park’s Year 8 side produced a dominant and confident display in the second round of the Hampshire Cup, easing past Toynbee School with an impressive 8–1 victory.

From the first whistle, Purbrook looked switched on and hungry. Their high tempo and aggressive pressing immediately put Toynbee on the back foot, and it took only minutes for the breakthrough to come. Two early goals set the tone, giving Purbrook full control of the match and the confidence to dictate play. The team moved the ball superbly, keeping possession with patience and purpose while constantly threatening in the final third.

Monty was the standout performer of the day, showcasing his finishing ability with a superb hat-trick. Dexter added a well-taken goal of his own, while Rudy, Toby, Edison, and Teddy each contributed with clinical strikes to complete the team’s eight-goal tally.

Toynbee managed a consolation goal, but it did little to disrupt Purbrook’s rhythm in the first half. The defence stayed organised, the midfield worked tirelessly to maintain control, and the attack looked dangerous every time they surged forward.

Overall, it was a complete team performance—full of energy, composure, and confidence. With an 8–1 win in the bag, Purbrook Park march into the next round of the Hampshire Cup with real momentum and belief. Well done to the whole team.

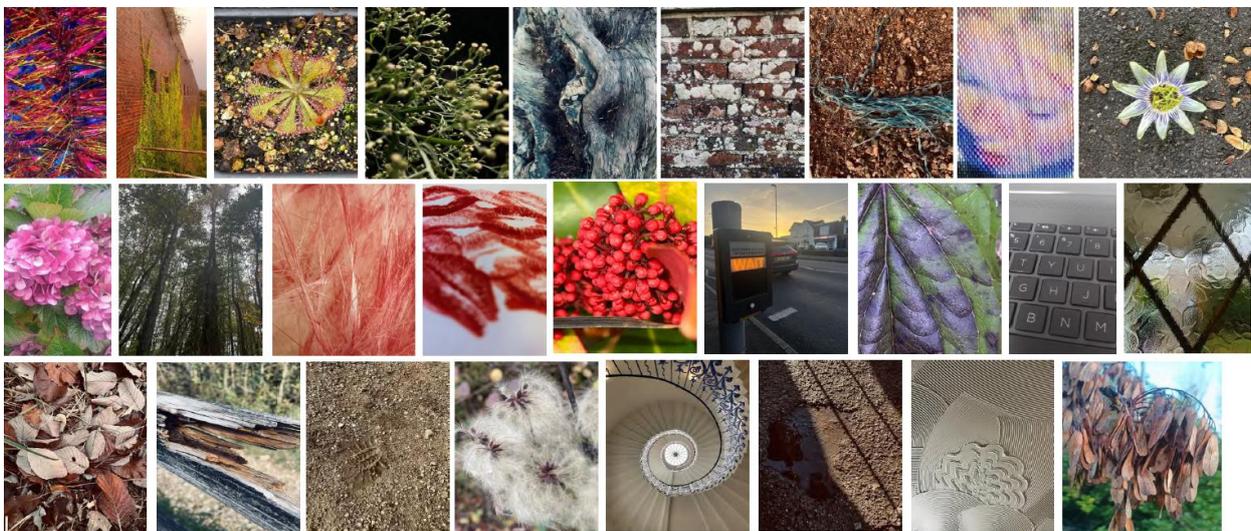

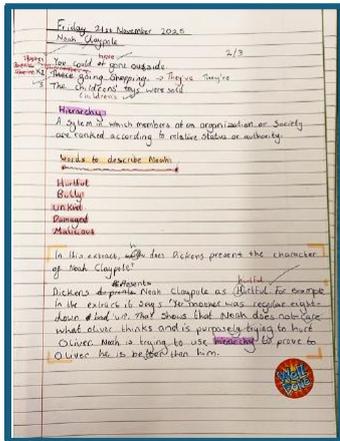

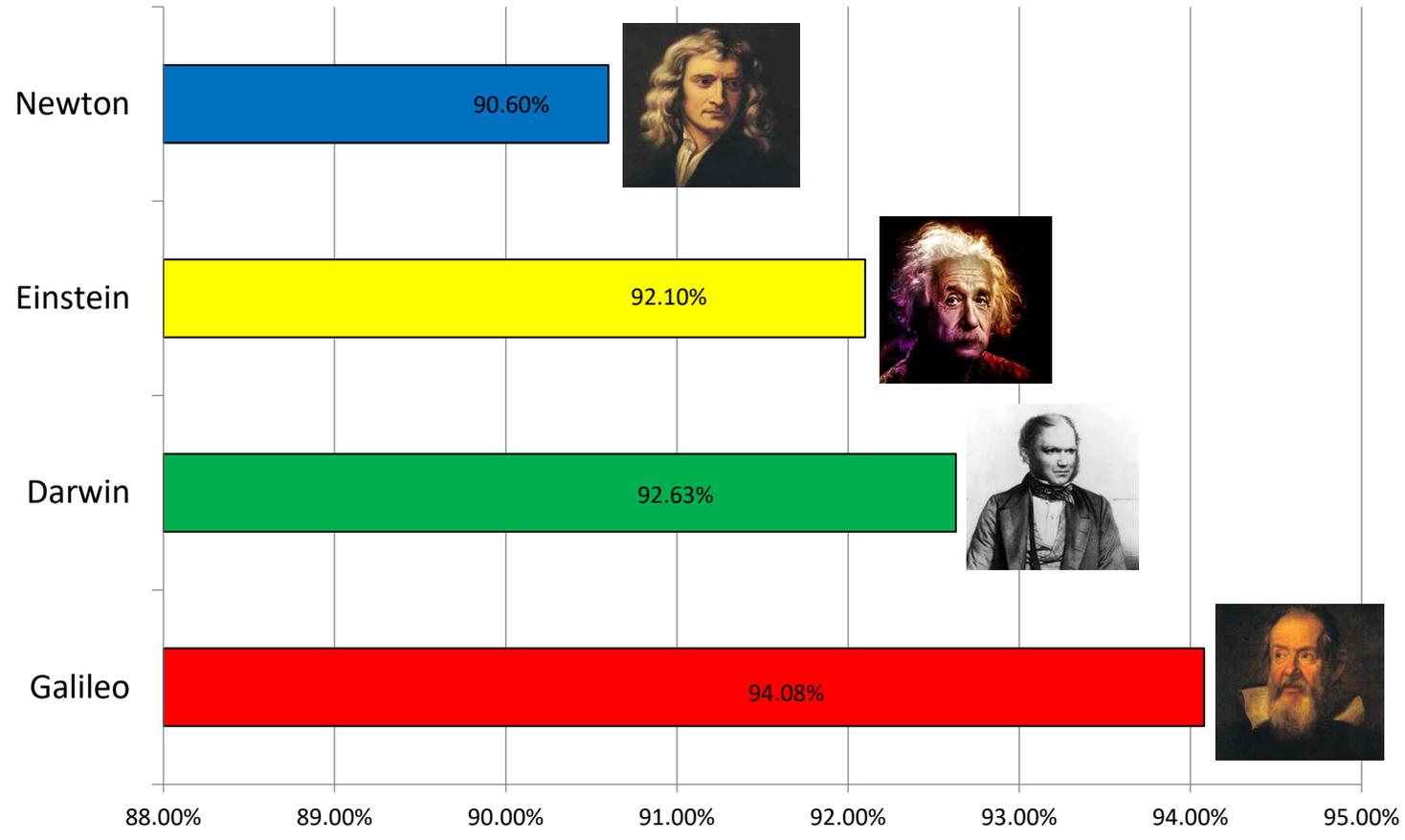


Can you help us by becoming a PDL Panel Expert?

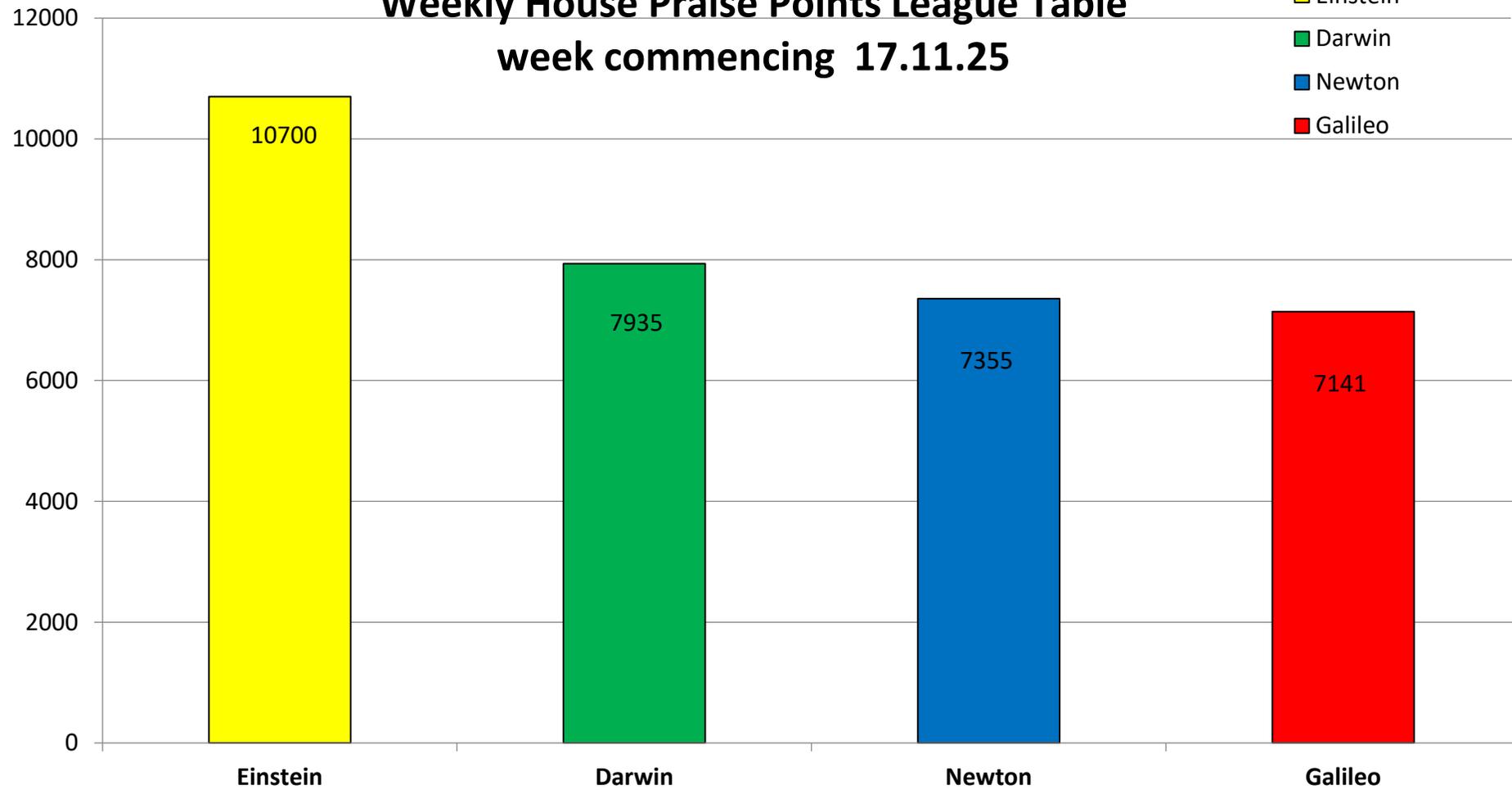

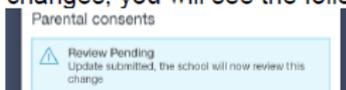
